

Planning and Development Services Director

A fantastic opportunity awaits you to lead this multi-disciplinary department focused on the nexus of urban planning, housing, transportation, climate and equity to connect people to their community. Do you inspire those around you to look for innovative and creative solutions? Are you a visionary about modern cities?

As the Planning and Development Services Director, you will lead a talented department in anticipating and planning for the opportunities and needs which accompany a rapidly growing and emerging Western city.

Planning and Development Services is made up of more than 100 team members in five divisions that include current and long-term urban planning, building, housing/community development and operations/administration. The department's combined budget is \$21M for FY2022.

The PDS Director will partner with departments across the organization using a systems approach by integrating people, process and technology, and leveraging the highest value opportunities.

The city is unique: the streets are managed by an independent, countywide highway district. The Director will need to collaborate successfully with this agency, a valley-wide transit authority, and an independent urban-renewal agency. The director will also engage and partner in cooperative working relationships with diverse constituency groups such as neighborhood associations, professional trade organizations, the public, local businesses, inter-governmental agencies, news media, elected officials, and others.

IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate will have municipal experience in urban planning, urban renewal land use, development, inspections, housing, building regulations, comprehensive planning, and community development, in addition to knowledge of planning and development principles and practices, code administration, and ordinance development/enforcement. The ideal candidate should have experience working in a fast-paced environment and dealing with the complex issues related to a growing community.

The ideal candidate should be a forward-thinking leader with a genuine interest in community engagement. This individual must be politically astute with proven experience in building and maintaining a broad spectrum of partnerships both internally and with the community to ensure that a common vision is enacted and supported.

The ideal candidate must have the capacity and interest to be an effective mentor and leader for staff. Strong collaboration and team building skills will be necessary for this individual; advanced public presentation skills, written and oral communication skills are imperative.

- + The City of Boise has a strong mayor-council form of government. The Mayor works full- time, managing the operations of the city andproviding policy direction and leadership to the City Council. The six-member City Council has budget and policy-setting authority for the city, each working part-time for a four- year term. Operating on a 2021 budget of \$450M, the City of Boise has a highly engaged workforce of over 1,800 employees.
